

Asian and Pacific Islanders in San Francisco: Income Snapshot 2017

Asian and Pacific Islanders (AP&I) make up 35% of San Francisco's population while **42% of all low-income residents in San Francisco are A&PI**. While rising costs have been accompanied by an estimated 31.8 percent of income, according to San Francisco's Budget and Legislative office in 2017, there has been an unequal distribution of this increase among household income across city neighborhoods, and among different ethnicities.

The neighborhoods with the highest median household income, on average, from 2011 to 2015 include the Presidio, Potrero Hill, Sea Cliff, West of Twin Peaks and Noe Valley. The poorest neighborhoods include the Tenderloin, Chinatown, McLaren Park, and Lakeshore. APIs show a bimodal median income across various neighborhoods and often have a higher number of residents per household with an annual median income of \$69,577. Pacific Islanders (PI) have the second lowest annual median income disparity after African Americans of \$35,313. Below is a snapshot of Asian and Pacific Islander median income by neighborhood.
